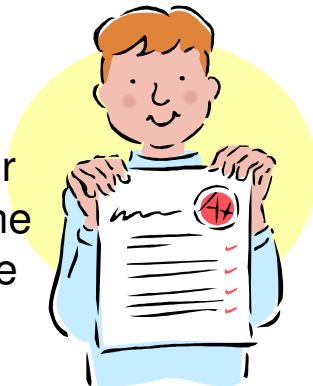

MTL programme development

- There are well over 50 separate validation processes going on
- All nine MTL Provider consortia have produced a commonly agreed programme – a CAP – in line with the national MTL programme, ensuring coherence and consistency across all providers
- Agreed national resolutions on programme details including arrangements for credit transfer and pass/fail criteria.

MTL coaches

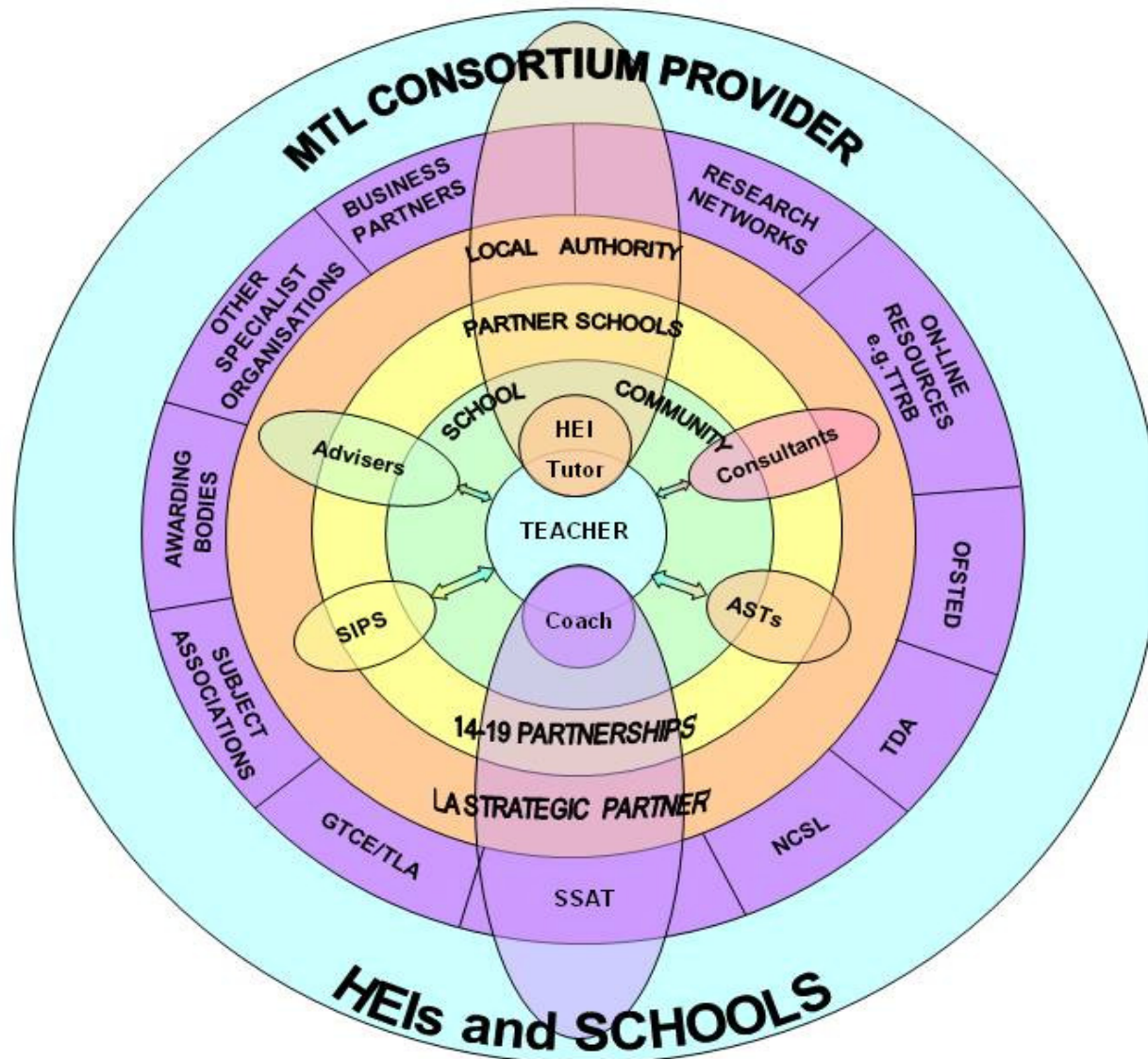
- A full set of documents supporting the training of MTL coaches is now available.
 - The *Trainers handbook* sets out a detailed training programme for MTL coaches.
 - The programme will combine core elements to be delivered face to face with additional topics that can be delivered online, through virtual learning environments (VLEs) or drawing on parts of existing training programmes.
 - There will also be scope for MTL coaches to gain their own masters-level credits.
- The handbook is supported by a *Coaching strategy* setting out the role and responsibilities of the MTL coach, a set of *Coaching strategy guidelines* explaining how to recruit and develop MTL coaches and a *National training framework* designed to underpin the training programme and ensure a consistent approach.
- The coach training itself will then be rolled out during the second half of the spring term.
